

Board Meeting Minutes

Minutes

- Board meeting minutes for June approved by unanimous vote
- 2020 Virtual LLVM Developer Meeting Update
 - Still working to get out of contracts for facilities
 - Plan to use Whova as the software platform
 - Pre-recorded videos will be hosted on Youtube
 - Need to decide on ticket cost
 - Reasonable option might be to have a “supporter” ticket class (which should still be much cheaper than it would be for the in-person meeting, maybe \$50)
 - Then also a free registrations category, especially for students
 - Event cost should be around \$30,000 (compared to roughly \$350,000 for the in-person meeting in San Jose)
 - We’d like to still have t-shirts, but need to figure out logistics
 - T-shirts will likely be decoupled from event registration -- people buy them separately
 - Perhaps some extra swag for speakers?
- Infrastructure
 - We’ve had outages recently related to Mailman using all disk space on our AWS instance, problem ended up being bounced messages using a lot of disk space including AOL addresses
 - Our instance used more than 400 TB in June, mostly due to downloads of our Debian packages, perhaps by CI systems
 - This is really expensive, we’ll almost certainly have to stop hosting the apt overlay and rather distribute through Github releases
- Status of Bugzilla migration
 - Strong desire in the community to keep the full history, preserve bug ids, etc.
 - This is tied to moving to pull reqs since on Github, issues and PRs share a namespace
- Relicensing status
 - It’s done except for the long tail

- This last part is moving slowly due to some personnel issues, but moving
- CoC update
 - Next step is incorporating comments on the version sent to the list
 - Need to form the committee now
- GSOC
 - 18 projects are going this summer
 - 17 students recently passed the first evaluation round, next evaluation is at the end of this month
- Board elections coming up, applications due end of July
